Box Tops

Caramel Brownies Ingredients:

- 1 box (1 lb 2.4 oz) Betty Crocker Original Supreme Brownie Mix
- ½ cup vegetable oil
- ½ cup water
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup coarsely chopped nuts
- 1 cup semisweet chocolate chips
- 25 caramels, unwrapped
- 2 tablespoons milk

Directions:

- 1. Heat oven to 350 (325 for dark or nonstick pans) Grease bottom only of 13x9-inch pan. In medium bowl, stir
- brownie mix, pouch of chocolate syrup, oil, water and eggs until well blended.
 Spread in pan. In a small bowl, combine

- nuts and chocolate chips: sprinkle half of mixture over batter in pan. Set aside remaining nut mixture.
- 3. Bake 30 minutes. Meanwhile, place caramels and milk in small microwavable bowl, microwave uncovered on HIGH 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 minutes, stirring every minute until caramels are melted.
- 4. After removing pan from oven, immediately spoon caramel mixture over brownie to within 1/2 inch of sides; sprinkle with remaining nut mixture. Return to oven and bake an additional 10 minutes until toothpick inserted into brownie 2 inches from side of pan comes out almost clean. Cool completely, about 1 1/2 hours. For brownies, cut into 8 rows by 5 rows. Store covered at room temperature
